**Two-day village halt and public hearing - Legal Awareness and Legal Aid Clinic**

**An Extension Programme organised by IQAC, National Service Scheme, and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, SSV College and CULAC, SLS, CUSAT**

<b>Date</b>	28-29 August 2022
<b>Objective</b>	To spread legal awareness and provide legal aid to the residents of Irapuram Village in Kunnathunadu Thaluk.
<b>Beneficiaries</b>	Residents of Irapuram Village
<b>Outcome</b>	<p><b>(a) Awareness on Legal and Social Issues</b> In terms of the legal awareness pertaining to particular legal and social problems, the legal awareness programme was able to impart basic awareness among the attendees and majority expressed positive feedback. People were able to recognize their rights and learned about the importance of protecting their rights.</p> <p><b>(b) Knowledge of Concerned Authorities to be Approached</b> When questioned on their knowledge of the concerned authorities to be approached for legal assistance and for seeking justice on various legal and social issues, most of the surveyed individuals and attendees of the awareness class displayed lack of awareness. The legal awareness class provided information about various redressal mechanism channels and distributed a pamphlet containing information about various helpline numbers. Feedback taken from the attendees showed that the class was effective and that would now make use of the helpline channels to seek redress.</p> <p><b>(c) Legal Advice to Resolve Various Grievances</b> In the public hearing, most displayed a lack of awareness about handling disputes and grievances and the committee constituted for the public hearing provided them advice as to the mechanisms available and the various methods by which an individual can seek redressal to their grievances.</p>

The Internal Quality Assessment Cell (IQAC), Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) and National Service Scheme (NSS), Sree Sankara Vidyapeetom



College, Valayanchirangara, Ernakulam and the Cochin University Legal Aid Clinic (CULAC), in its endeavor to spread legal awareness among the community and to analyze, study and provide redress to the grievances faced by resident had, organised a 2-day village halt and public hearing at Irapuram Village on 28.08.2022 and 29.08.2022.

In the two-day programme, the volunteers of CULAC and NSS and UBA, SSV College, along with faculty ~~and~~ worked as a team to disseminate necessary legal awareness among the community and took efforts to provide redressal to the grievances faced by the local community. The volunteers carried out surveys to identify socio-legal issues faced by the residents of Airapuram village and legal awareness classes were held at the college with active public participation. Further, a public hearing was conducted where the attendees raised several of the issued faced by them and the committee provided appropriate legal advice.

The volunteers of CULAC along with student volunteers of NSS surveyed eighty-one households in Airapuram Village. Two pre-identified socio-legal issues, namely 1. Lack of knowledge about government programmes and 2. Problems related to guest labour, were the focus of a survey that was done by volunteers. The survey was conducted to study and analyze the position of these issues in the village. Another survey was conducted in the village to identify problems to be discussed in the public hearing.

Further, on 28-08-2022, a legal awareness class was conducted on the subject of law generally and specifically on the following topics:

1. Domestic violence
2. Child sexual harassment and Child abuse



3. Child marriage
4. Rights of the elderly/ senior citizens
5. Dowry Prohibition and Matrimonial Issues
6. Various Government Schemes
7. Helplines and Redressal Mechanisms

There was active public participation and most of the attendees expressed great interest and provided feedback that the classes helped them gain awareness about several legal provisions, government schemes and redressal mechanisms. On 29.08.2022, a Public Hearing was conducted on the issues identified through the survey conducted by the volunteers. The major issues faced by the villagers were; 1. Lack of awareness about legal aid and, 2. Poor access to welfare schemes and redressal mechanisms. The Hearing was presided by the three-member committee consisting of:

1. Dr. Binumole K, Faculty Co-ordinator
2. Mr. Babukuttan, Retired Tahsildar and social worker
3. Mrs. Praseela Ashokan, ADS Secretary, Aiarapuram.

In the hearing some of the attendees raised problems about issues such as nuisance, delay in grant of benefits of welfare schemes etc., and the committee provided appropriate legal advice to the aggrieved in order to assist them avail quick redress. The Right to Information Act of 2005 and the rights granted to individuals under the Act were explained to the audience. Additionally, provisions dealing to the maintenance of parents, wives, and children under the CrPC and other laws were introduced.





## INFERENCE

A survey among the villagers about their educational qualification revealed that nearly 86% of them had completed their matriculation. The major inference from the survey and public hearing is that the residents lacked basic legal awareness and had little interest in becoming cognizant about law and personal rights. Most of the surveyed individuals showed no interest in learning about legal provisions and the redressal mechanisms available and they showed reluctance in answering to the questions related to migrant workers. The survey also pointed that residents faced huge delay in availing benefits of welfare scheme due to complex application procedures and difficulty to follow up on any of their requests or applications. However, it is important to note that the villagers who attended the class were highly attentive and showed great interest in becoming aware of basic legal provisions and the helpline channels and redressal mechanisms. The resident's association (CARA) expressed their interest in hosting such legal awareness classes to impart legal awareness among the community. Feedback showed that the attendees had gained cognizance of the several channels and mechanisms available and the services provided by legal services authority and legal aid clinics. The attendees expressed their acceptance towards these instrumentalities and conveyed that they shall approach and make use of the services available to avail remedy. The camp ended by 5 PM with the valedictory session.
