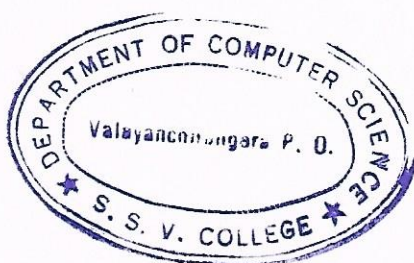

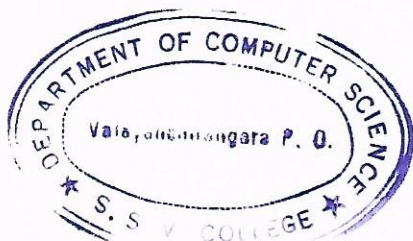

#### Students:

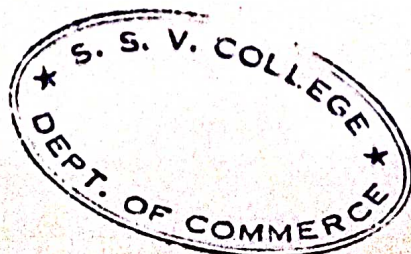
**Positive Feedback:** Students appreciated engaging classes, extracurricular activities, and student support services

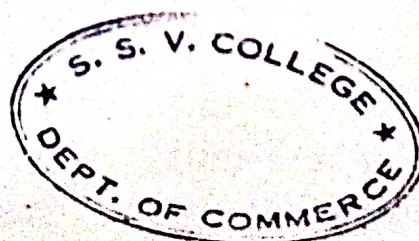
