At the beginning of the academic year, The Internal Quality Assurance Cell framed the college schedule for all activities, curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular, in accordance with the activities of the affiliated University, considering the recommendations in the previous NAAC Report.

The IQAC supervised and gave suggestions in preparing and implementing the schedules and plans of the various Departments' academic and administrative activities adhering to the College Plan 2017-18.

The IQAC facilitated the administration by reconstituting the statutory/non-statutory bodies such as Anti-Ragging Cell, SC/ST Monitoring Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, UGC Cell, Planning Board, Disciplinary Committee, Admission Committee, Library Advisory Committee, Women's forum, Internal Complaints Committee and Surprise Inspection Squad.

Conducted a National Level Workshop on NAAC- Revised Academic Framework

After evaluating the reports of the various clubs, forums and committees, the IQAC assisted the Principal in redesigning staffs in charge for them.

Nominated a coordinator for the effective functioning of tutorial and remedial teaching. Each student has a personal tutor and can approach the tutor for personal and academic guidance.

Assigned an experienced faculty member as in-house counsellor for students, who was to provide primary counselling assistance and to identify those students who need further attention. Services from two external professional counsellors were availed and sessions were arranged.

Gave suggestions to the departments to apply for UGC fund for Research Projects and organising seminars, workshops etc.

Provided SPARK Master training for non-teaching staff of institutions in the state.

Initiated Training in Communicative English to all the Non-teaching staff using Language Lab.

Encouraged faculties to indulge in research activities.

Fostered innovation and creativity in students through exhibitions, group discussions, poster presentations, photography competitions, short film contests, study tours etc.

Following the instructions of IQAC, various clubs, forums and committees made several endeavours that foster social responsibility among students. Construction of *Snehaveedu* (Home of Love), *Alivu* (Benevolence) weekly food collection for the desolate, visits to orphanages, old age homes and palliative care units are a few to mention.

Ensured the overall physical and spiritual wellbeing of the members of the college family with their optimum participation in fitness-oriented activities by availing the services from the Health Club, Yoga Club and the Department of Physical Education.

Encouraged NSS, *Bhaumika* and other forums to bring in ecological concern among students by maintaining water harvesting pits, e-waste management etc. Constituted two new clubs, Birds Club and Bike Club, to add empathy in students
