The workshop covered various topics, including the structure and components of the revised framework, the assessment and accreditation process, and the role of stakeholders in the evaluation process.



Programme Report in Detail

Academicians need to have a thorough understanding regarding the research design, data management techniques and statistical tools. But knowledge regarding how to make your paper worth for a top-rated journal and how to publish is equally important. This FDP is designed to address the faculty and equip them with the basic skills to publish in top rated journals.

Objectives of the FDP was to

- To enhance the skills of academicians to write a quality research paper
- To impart knowledge regarding the review process of different journals.
- To help them to select the right journal for publication



FDP was designed to train and motivate the faculty to engage in research activities in a meaningful manner. The session was handled in online mode through Google Platform. The first session of the day was handled by Prof. Dr. P. Ramalingam. He covered the basics of research and the process involved in it. He explained that the process of research involves identifying a research question, conducting a literature review, formulating a hypothesis or research objectives, collecting, and analyzing data, and drawing conclusions or making recommendations based on the findings. He also detailed the involvement of a variety of methods, such as quantitative, qualitative, and mixed-methods approaches in research.

The next session was handled by Dr. Girish S Pathy. He explained the academic writing with special reference to the case study method of writing. He described the case study method which focuses on a specific phenomenon, event, or situation, and examines it in detail with examples. Case study research can contribute to theory building by providing empirical support for existing theories or generating new hypotheses and models. The detailed analysis of a case can provide insights into the underlying processes and mechanisms that drive the phenomenon being studied.

The final session was handled by Dr. Hareesh Ramanathan. He explained the importance of publishing for the academic community. Publish or Perish is the current era's Slogan. He explained the ways in which quality of publishing can be achieved by the academicians.





-Day 3 - 09/10/2021





Introduction:




